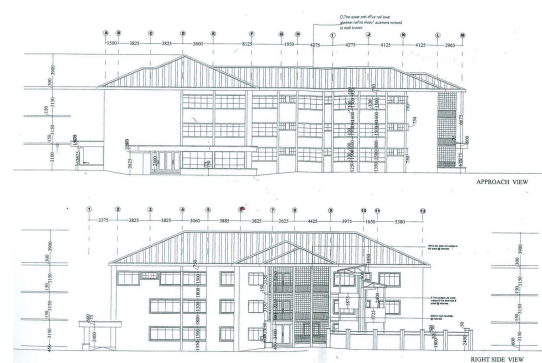
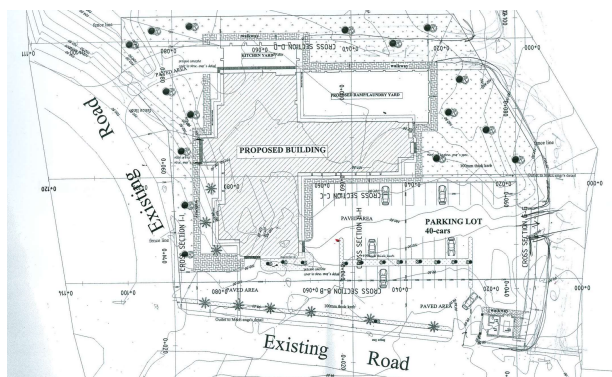
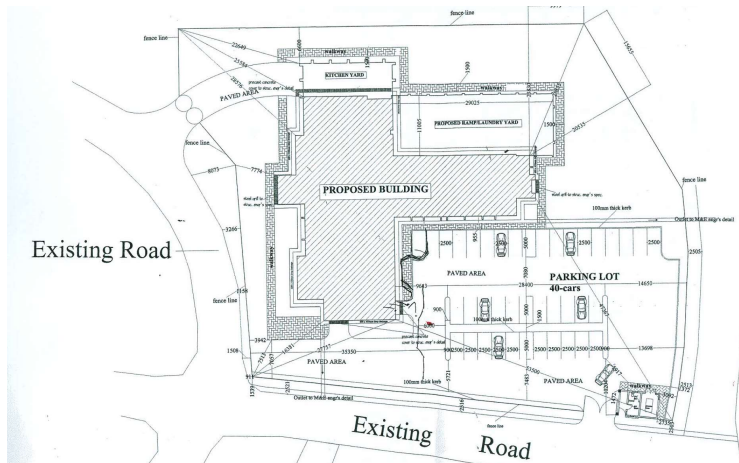


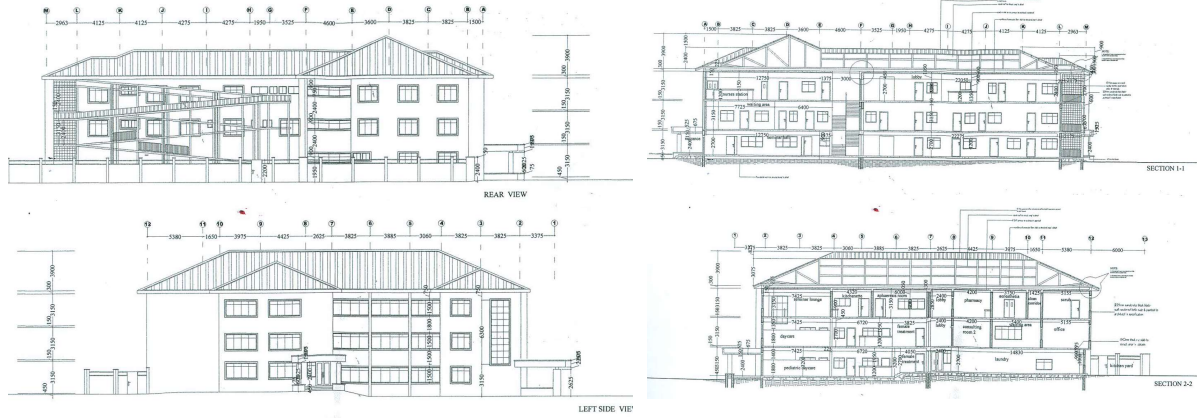
## PROPOSED SICKLE CELL CENTRE FOR UNIVERSITY COLLEGE HOSPITAL, IBADAN

The federal government of Nigeria commissioned the construction of a dedicated sickle cell centre at the UCH, Ibadan. ### Site Plan

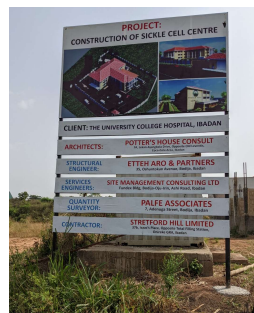




### **Abandoned site - June 2021**

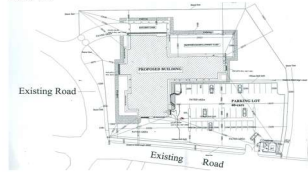

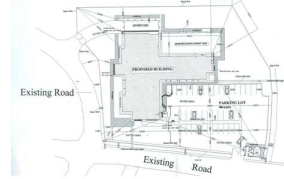

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Site Plan



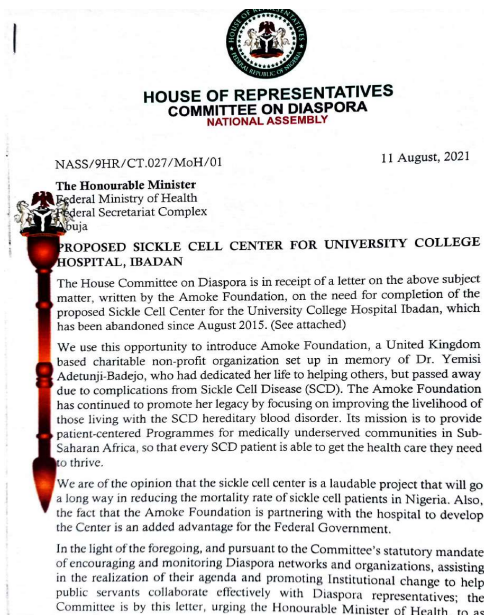
